Curriculum

The curriculum at Nā Kamali'i Hoaloha is based upon respect. Our classroom is set up to support children in making independent choices.

Activity centers include: dramatic play, blocks, art, literacy, discovery, math, puzzles & games.

We follow the interests of the whole group and of individual children to develop meaningful learning experiences and in-depth studies of our world.



At Na Kamali'i Hoaloha we strive to provide quality child care and education. The following excerpts from the National Association for the Education of Young Children's *10 Signs of a great Preschool* guide us in our practice.

Children spend most of their time playing and working with materials or other children.

Children have access to various activities throughout the day.

Teachers work with individual children, small groups, and the whole group at different times during the day.

The classroom is decorated with children's original artwork.

Children learn numbers and the alphabet in the context of their everyday experiences.

Children work on projects and have long periods of time (at least one hour) to play and explore.

Children have an opportunity to play outside every day.

Teachers read books to children individually or in small groups throughout the day, not just at group story time.

Curriculum is adapted for those who are ahead as well as those who need additional help.

Children and their parents look forward to school. Parents feel secure about sending their child to the program.
